Ethical decision-making framework for AAHYA

AAHYA personnel must use this checklist before collecting or sharing information, stories, messages or images about the people and communities we assist. This applies whether or not we are collecting the information for research or evaluation purposes, or to share with our donors and supporters.

Before you collect or share information, stories, messages or images about the people and communities we assist, ask:
